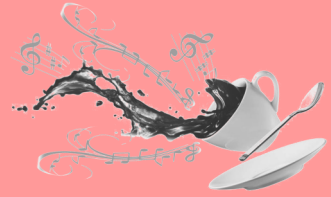


# MIDTOWN COFFEEHOUSE

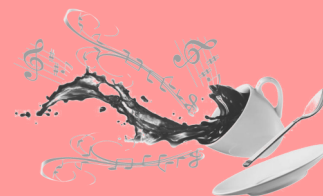
March 9
